On Thursday, February 10, BCNA will sponsor an aldermanic candidate forum at the Bahai Center (324 W. Lakeside) beginning at 7 pm. The primary election takes place on Tuesday, February 15. These are statements from the four candidates:

Micah Berken (1312 Mound St.): As your alderman, I would be proud to represent the Bay Creek neighborhood as one of the most naturally beautiful places in the city of Madison. I will make sure that this beauty is not encroached upon by future development. I don't think that Bay Creek needs new high-rise office towers or luxury apartments; instead, I'm going to focus on improving and maintaining the wonderful things that our neighborhood already has. My focus is on small business development, schools, and the repair of existing structures.

Neighborhood safety is also a big part of my plans for Bay Creek. I think that citizens should have the security to enjoy a walk around the place where they live without the fear of crime, noise or excessive traffic. He stresses he does not want to be a professional politician but wants to help out his neighbors.

Thomas (TJ) Mertz (1210 Gilson St.): My family has lived in Bay Creek for the past sixteen years. I have been working diligently to improve school–community relations, increase open and responsive government, and enact smart public budgeting and investments, while promoting equal opportunities for all Madison residents.

As your alder, I will work very hard to build on these efforts. I am dedicated to fostering more progressive values in all areas of city government including transportation, housing, parks and recreation, public safety and more.

The various political machinations surrounding the Edgewater project have led many to perceive that government primarily serves powerful insiders. I believe that everything the city does – from sidewalk repairs to major initiatives – benefits, when the wider community is involved.

BCNA January 10, 2011 Meeting Summary

Bob Stoffs reported that "Celebrate South Madison" is on January 27 and will include food, entertainment and kids' events. The Newsletter Editor reported that the next edition will be coming out the first week of February. The Web Committee reported that a group of neighbors is currently working on a redesign of the website and progress on that project is expected soon.

The Treasurer reported that BCNA is still solvent but the cost of publishing the Bulletin currently exceeds the advertising revenue. Attendees agreed to look into pursuing additional advertisers. It was noted that ads in the bulletin are a good deal given its distribution to 1,500 households.

A neighborhood artist is volunteering to design new neighborhood welcome signs and presented a mock-up. Neighbors expressed compliments on the design and appreciation for his volunteer efforts. The estimated cost of replacing the three current welcome signs with the new design is \$9,000. BCNA intends to submit a grant application to the City to fund the project.

The idea of holding a candidate forum for the current candidates for the District 13 Madison Common Council seat was discussed and the forum is scheduled for Thursday, February 10th at 7pm at the Baha'i Center (324 W. Lakeside Street). Neighbors discussed possibly recording the forum and podcasting it on the neighborhood web site.

County Supervisor Kyle Richmond mentioned that he was asked to serve on a task force for a project that is creating a new vision for the John Nolan Drive corridor between the Beltline and Downtown. Kyle summarized the project and said that meetings about it would begin in late January. Kyle also reported on the upcoming launch of a new county grant program for park projects of "regional significance" and suggested exploring opportunities to use those funds for a project at Olin Park. On a related note, the next meeting of Friends of Olin Tuville (FOOT) will be on February 14 at 6:30pm at the South Madison Library. Anyone interested in preserving and enhancing Olin-Turville Park is encouraged to attend.

The next BCNA meeting will be on March 14 when election of officers will take place

Dane County News

Kyle Richmond, Dane County Supervisor, sent an electronic report to the Bay Creek email list. Kyle is chair of the Environmental, Agriculture & Natural Resources Committee as well as a member of the Parks Commission and Farmland Preservation Subcommittee. In the first role, he drafted the legislation to enable development of the newly installed manure digester (one of two) which converts methane to electricity. Besides being a green-or brown-source of energy, the digester solves the problem of dealing with animal waste and protects the Yahara watershed from run-off.

The County Park Division will create a Parks & Open Space Plan this year to set priorities for recreation, wild-life, open space and agricultural lands. Kyle will participate as a member of the Park Commission.

MedDrop in Madison opened to provide for disposal of household drugs. Boxes are currently being piloted in east Madison and in Middleton.

Great News on Randall School - Olive Jones Park Renovation

2010 was a wonderful year for phase 1 of the renovation of Olive Jones Park – Randall School Park. We raised over \$100,000 and installed a fantastic new play structure that has been a huge hit with the kids. 2011 is off to a great start with three exciting announcements:

- □ City of Madison's People for Parks fund will MATCH donations to the park, dollar for dollar, up to \$50,000. Each dollar you contribute this year will go twice as far!
- □ The City has allocated \$50,000 in impact fees to this project, money from area development set aside for improvement of local green space, to improve the park.
- □ A recognition program will allow contributors, past and future, to have their names inscribed on pavers in permanent recognition of their contributions. You can be part of neighborhood history! More details on this program will be on our website soon.

Next up is construction of a neighborhood playground for younger children at the corner of Roby and Chadbourne, an amphitheater for community events and outdoor classroom experiences, better landscaping and fences, and improved pedestrian entrances. The final phase will be repairing of the central play area.

Keep Sidewalks Clear

The City of Madison requires that sidewalks be cleared by noon of the day after snow stops. Property owners face fines up to \$114 if sidewalks are not cleared. If the sidewalk cannot be cleared to the cement, sprinkle remaining snow and/or ice with sand. Sand is available free at Brittingham Park and several neighborhood sites:

Olin & Park - NE corner

Olin & Gilson - NW corner

Lakeside & Lake Court

Lakeside & Rowell - SE corner

Gilson & Lakeside

Bring your own container and scoop. The city does not automatically refill the barrels so if any of them are getting low call 266-4681 to report it.

What to do if you notice unshoveled walks in your neighborhood? Talk to your neighbor whether in person, by telephone or by leaving a note in the doorway.
